Community Engagement Research Program (CERP)

This program supports community-university research partnerships, obtains community input into university research, and increases health research in community settings that is responsive to the health needs of the community. It connects existing academic community research programs from Morehouse School of Medicine and Emory University, transforms research from a scientist-subject interaction to an equitable partnership, and trains investigators in principles of community-based participatory research.

- Health Promotion Initiative that relies on community health workers to deliver a health promotion package to community partners
- A two-credit course on Community Engagement in Clinical Research and seminars on communitybased participatory research
- The Satcher Health Leadership Institute provides training to leaders of community partners to help build capacity in the organizations they represent
- CERP Mini-Grant Program invites proposals for partnership-based health projects that involve collaboration between a community organization and a faculty member
